Sudbury Telehandler Certification - Telehandler certification programs are both for operators who have some experience driving a standard forklift and for those with no experience. The real-world training offered by these courses produces graduates well versed in the safe and right use of these kinds of equipment.

Telehandler certification courses are provided in two forms: at a training facility; at the trainee's job site. With the former alternative, the manufacturer can work with a licensing agency to bring individuals to a training facility. This option offers trainees with the chance to learn to make use of the machinery in a controlled environment. Upon completion, people who participated are given a license or certification to utilize this kind of machinery.

With the latter option, a trained instructor is sent to a work place to be able to provide on-location training. This option ensures that the trainee is instructed on actual equipment which would be utilized on the job, and prepares the one training for the demands of that particular environment. Trainees learn about potentially dangerous situations that could take place on the actual work location. The instruction focuses on whichever situation that are specific to the work place, allowing operators to be ready to safely handle these elements.

The word "telehandler" is an abbreviated version of "telescopic handler," referring to an equipment which has an extending or telescoping arm supporting a fork. A telehandler has different controls and characteristics similar to a forklift. A telehandler has the capability of transporting and lifting loads up and away from the vehicle. Incorrect operation of telehandlers could lead to serious accidents. If load limits are exceeded, the equipment can tip due to excess weight on the lift. It is the task of the operator to know load limitations and to use these equipment safely.

Telehandler programs designed for operators who are already certified to make use of a forklift are known as "conversion" classes. These classes teach the differences between telehandlers and forklifts, and prevent repeating information that forklift operators already know. For trainees who have no former experience using telehandler machines, training includes the basic utilization and operation of the equipment. Some groups likewise offer refresher courses.
