Like for instance, a crane operator should take an in-depth training course and must pass various certification exams in order to become a crane operator, while truck drivers can only require some on the job training to go along with their CDL. The in-depth training which follows particular machinery is necessary since much of the work happens in dangerous scenarios and dangerous scenes so the operator must be able to ensure a safe working environment all the time. The safety training is vital as well as the communications training that helps the crew on the ground be able to always communicate with the operator.

Heavy equipment machines often work in extreme surroundings and are put under great strain on a regular basis. Therefore, there are many heavy equipment jobs available in maintenance and repair. Heavy machinery operators are really trained workers who can diagnose, troubleshoot and repair heavy machines on site or in a workshop. Mechanics have to be ready to transport their tools to a job site and carry out maintenance and repair in various surroundings.

It might be possible for delivery drivers to acquire work with just a CDL, though for some jobs, certain endorsements might be needed. Like for example, delivering large pieces of machines or parts which are really big for building projects would need the driver to complete further training in order to haul and handle oversize loads. Normally, the drivers operate together with chaperone vehicles that are driven by trained drivers. These chaperone vehicles typically escort the delivery truck to its destination.
